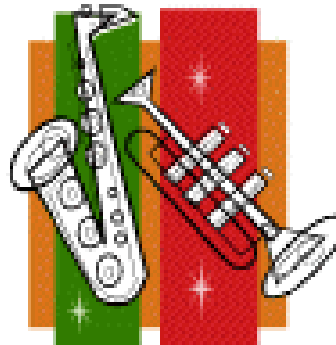

## World Music Summer Institute (June 21 - 27, 2009)

The World Music Summer Institute is a one-week program, designed to expose high school and interested community members to the repertoire and musical styles of one of four performance traditions: The music of African Americans, The music of China, The music of Korea, The music of Mexico. High school students may stay in a UCLA residence hall under the supervision of experienced counselors. The non-residential program is open to students of all ages. Two units of academic credit are offered by the University of California following completion of the program. Instructors teach regularly in the Department of Ethnomusicology.
